District Governor, Jean is a native of Pennsylvania who has lived in Wytheville, VA for over 40 years. She retired as Director of Materials Management in 2011 from Wythe County Community Hospital after 33 years of service. Her hobbies include gardening, jigsaw puzzles, family ancestry, and many sports, especially, the Tennessee Volunteers. She is a member of Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church in Wytheville and serves as Treasurer, Finance Committee Chair, member of the United Methodist Women, maintains the church landscape, and sings in the choir. She is a VFW Lifetime Member and a member of the Wythe County Historical Society.

Since joining the Wytheville Lions in 2009 from the encouragement of a close Lion friend, she found the work of the Lions to be very rewarding and beneficial to the local community; as well, as the world. Highlight of her service to the community was the development of the Memorial Day Flag Placement Project in 2012. At present, the Wytheville Lions Club is providing over 900 flags in 34 cemeteries in Wythe County each Memorial Day.

During 2016-2017, Lion Jean served as the first female President of the Wytheville Club in its 75 Years of existence. Her leadership brought different perspectives to the club; especially in being instrumental in increasing the female membership of the club.

Her work in Lions continued to the District holding the positions of Zone chair, various District chairs, and the VDGs. During that time she started the first Leo Club in the Wythe County Schools, continues as the Club Advisor, and the District Leo Club Chair promoting the involvement of youth in Lions.

The Corona pandemic has changed the way we live our lives and the way we SERVE, but the District Governor Jean is challenging Lions to continue their service safely because our service is needed NOW more than ever.

PDG Donald W. Rhinehart



Donald Walker Rhinehart, 86 years old, born January 27, 1934 in Roanoke, Virginia passed away June 29, 2020 in Bethesda, Maryland at a local hospital. Formerly a lifelong resident of Roanoke, he had recently moved with family to Bethesda, MD for the last three years.

Don served in the United States Army working both at the Pentagon and in South Korea. After graduating from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, he began his career at Fralin and Waldron, Inc. and served as Vice President until he retired. Don and his wife, Jewell, raised three children in Roanoke until her passing in 1997. Don committed his life to his family and his community. As a lifetime member of the Roanoke Host Lions Club, he served and actively participated holding offices until proudly serving as Virginia Lions District Governor. He volunteered for the Lions Sight Foundation downtown and supported programs for the

Virginia Department for the Blind and Vision Impaired and Leader Dogs for the Blind as well as serving on various committees at local, state and international levels.

His community service extended in various capacities as a Scottish Rite Freemason and Shriner. Don was an active member of Christ Lutheran Church his entire life. His deep and strong faith inspired those he met as did his goodwill, generosity and kindness towards others. He supported the scholarship fund for students at Virginia Tech and local young aspiring musicians through various clubs and organizations.

Don was a dedicated husband, father, father-in-law, and grandfather. He cherished the many friends he met throughout his journey and the many he served along the way. He especially enjoyed traveling with family, fellow Lions members and dear friends. Don took pleasure in the Roanoke Symphony Orchestra, the Roanoke Arts And Music Festivals and was an avid supporter of Virginia Tech athletics. Don was fondly known by his grandchildren and their friends as "Poppy". He always shared a smile and a story with all he met and was adored by all seven of his grandchildren.

Don was preceded in death by his wife, Jewell Writtenberry Rhinehart, and his son, Steven L. Rhinehart. Survived by his daughter, Kathy Tigani and his son-in-law, Dr. Stephen P. Tigani of Bethesda, Md.; his son, Stuart Walker Rhinehart of Nashville, TN and seven grandchildren Dr. Elise Tigani, Stephen Tigani Jr., Lauren Tigani and Alexis Tigani all from Bethesda and McKenna Rhinehart, Chappell Rhinehart and Keaton Rhinehart all from Nashville.

A funeral service will be held at 2 p.m. on Monday, July 6th, 2020 at Oakey's South Chapel with Pastor Dave Skole officiating. A private interment will follow at Sherwood Memorial Park. As you may have gathered, this conference will be very casual – NO ties or fancy dresses!!


Please come and join me in one of District 24-C's picturesque settings and renew your enthusiasm to grow Lions in our District.

In a recent interview with our Publicity and Information Officer Lion Dharam Sawh MJF, District Governor Jean Cook talked about her goals for the next year. Recognizing the complexity of the times we are currently facing, D.G. Jean stated that "My first expectation is for all clubs in the district to start meeting face-to-face, if at possible, or on a routine schedule virtually by August 15, 2020 and notify me of this occurring. We are in an unclear path, but I feel with following social distancing guidelines and procedures, we can safely continue our service because our service is needed now more than ever.

Our district is losing both clubs and Lions. With that in mind, District Governor Jean would like to see all clubs work towards a common set of goals for the year which are as follows:

- 1. All clubs to end with at least a + 1.
- 2. Start 2 new clubs and revitalize 2 existing clubs.
- 3. Increase diversity in our clubs.
- 4. Continue the "Proud to be a Lion Program" for new Lions.
- 5. Each club or Zone plan for a new member orientation.
- 6. 65% education of Club Officers and 100% training of Region and Zone Chairs.
- 7. 80% of clubs to report service projects.
- 8. Start 2 new Leo Clubs and rejuvenate 2 Leo clubs.
- 9. 75% of District Clubs to contribute to the LCIF Campaign 100.
- 10. Promoting 100% club participation in our quarterly District Service Projects.
 - 1 st QTR. Vision
 - 2 nd QTR. Hunger
 - 3 rd QTR. Diabetes
 - 4 th QTR. Environment

This year will be a challenge to all, but I feel that we can overcome our challenges "TOGETHER" And experience new successes in serving our communities and growing Lionism.
