The Hope to Walk Project has been endorsed by the MD 24-C Lions and is in the initial stages of rolling out to our clubs. Hope to Walk in Blacksburg builds low cost prosthetic devices for amputees and custom fits them internationally to the poorest of the poor.

A donation of \$250 will make and put a prosthesis on an individual. A scoreboard will be kept of our Lions Clubs purchase of "legs." More detailed information will be included in this newsletter and if you need further information do not hesitate to contact me. I am excited about this PROJECT!!!!

Also, a District Service Award will be given out at the State Convention in April, 2021. An application will be out soon in order for you to enter your club's fantastic service projects.

In September's newsletter, I outlined the New Voices Initiative: 2020-2021 in detail. The search is still on for nominations in each of the four areas: SERVICE, MEMBERSHIP, LEADERSHIP, and MARKETING. I will also be awarding these certificates at the State Convention in April.



She retired as Director of Materials Management in 2011 from Wythe County Community Hospital after 33 years of service. Her hobbies include gardening, jigsaw puzzles, family ancestry, and many sports, especially, the Tennessee Volunteers. She is a member of Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church in Wytheville and serves as Treasurer, Finance Committee Chair, member of the United Methodist Women, maintains the church landscape, and sings in the choir. She is a VFW Lifetime Member and a member of the Wythe County Historical Society.

Since joining the Wytheville Lions in 2009 from the encouragement of a close Lion friend, she found the work of the Lions to be very rewarding and beneficial to the local community; as well, as the world. Highlight of her service to the community was the development of the Memorial Day Flag Placement Project in 2012. At present, the Wytheville Lions Club is providing over 900 flags in 34 cemeteries in Wythe County each Memorial Day.

During 2016-2017, Lion Jean served as the first female President of the Wytheville Club in its 75 Years of existence. Her leadership brought different perspectives to the club; especially in being instrumental in increasing the female membership of the club.

Her work in Lions continued to the District holding the positions of Zone chair, various District chairs, and the VDGs. During that time she started the first Leo Club in the Wythe County Schools, continues as the Club Advisor, and the District Leo Club Chair promoting the involvement of youth in Lions.

The Corona pandemic has changed the way we live our lives and the way we SERVE, but the District Governor Jean is challenging Lions to continue their service safely because our service is needed NOW more than ever.

Jean stated that "My first expectation is for all clubs in the district to start meeting face-to-face, if at possible, or on a routine schedule virtually by August 15, 2020 and notify me of this occurring. We are in an unclear path, but I feel with following social distancing guidelines and procedures, we can safely continue our service because our service is needed now more than ever.

Our district is losing both clubs and Lions. With that in mind, District Governor Jean would like to see all clubs work towards a common set of goals for the year which are as follows:

- 1. All clubs to end with at least a + 1.
- 2. Start 2 new clubs and revitalize 2 existing clubs.
- 3. Increase diversity in our clubs.
- 4. Continue the "Proud to be a Lion Program" for new Lions.
- 5. Each club or Zone plan for a new member orientation.
- 6. 65% education of Club Officers and 100% training of Region and Zone Chairs.
- 7. 80% of clubs to report service projects.
- 8. Start 2 new Leo Clubs and rejuvenate 2 Leo clubs.
- 9. 75% of District Clubs to contribute to the LCIF Campaign 100.
- 10. Promoting 100% club participation in our quarterly District Service Projects.

  - 2 nd QTR. Hunger
  - 3 rd QTR. Diabetes
  - 4 th QTR. Environment

Lion Lawrence T. "Larry" Nash Jr.

Service as a Lion from 1989 to 2020



It is with a heavy heart and a deep sense of loss that the Cave Spring Lions Club reports on the passing of two Lions a member and his sponsor within the same week. The first Lion is Larry Nash who unfortunately passed from his battle with COVID 19 on October 31, 2020. Lion Larry Nash had first joined the Roanoke Raleigh Court Lions Club in 1989. He served as a Club President from 2003 until 2005 when the club folded due to loss of members. Larry transferred his membership to the Cave Spring Lions Club immediately and served as Club President, Second Vice President, Club Membership Chair, and Board Member until his passing. A longtime member of the Lions Club, he volunteered weekly at the Lions Eyebank. For many years he volunteered at the Salem Food

Pantry. Lion Larry sponsored his brother in law (our second Lion) Lion Billy Bowers

His obituary stated it best. "Larry had such a zest for living, a deep love of family and spent much of his life serving others. First in the United States Navy, and then for many years in the Coast Guard Reserves, he took his love of country very seriously. After a long career in sales, marketing and engineering, he retired in 2003."

## Lion Fredrick W. "Billy" Bowers Service as a Lion from 2017 to 2020



On October 29, 2020, Cave Spring lost another Lion. Lion Billy Bowers lost his fight from cancer. Upon his retirement, Lion Billy Bowers joined the Cave Spring Lions Club in 2017 and became an active member by serving on the Board of Directors. His obituary described Billy as someone who greeted everyone with the warmth of his smile, and he had friends wherever he went.. Lion Billy was sponsored by Lion Larry Nash as he was a brother in law to Larry.

Our thoughts and prayers are extended to the families of both these fine men as well as to the members of the Cave Spring Lions Club.

## Virginia's Governor Northam will limit in-person gatherings, more amid COVID-19 surge to no more than 25.

Virginia will enact some tighter COVID-19 restrictions amid a surge in cases across the Commonwealth.

Those measures include limiting in-person gatherings to 25 people, an expanded face mask mandate, halting late-night alcohol sales at restaurants and increased enforcement of pandemic rules for essential businesses, such as grocery stores.

Gov. Ralph Northam's office announced the measures Friday in a news release.

"While the Commonwealth's case count per capita and positivity rate remain comparatively low, all five health regions are experiencing increases in new COVID-19 cases, positive tests and hospitalizations," the governor's office said.

Northam said though cases in Virginia are not rising "as rapidly" as in other U.S. states, he does "not intend to wait until they are. We are acting now to prevent this health crisis from getting worse."

These measures take effect starting midnight on Sunday, Nov. 15:

- Private and public in-person gatherings, both indoors and outdoors, are limited to 25 people, down from the current cap of 250. A gathering is defined as a party, celebration or other social event. The definition does not include workplaces, schools and restaurants. Religious services of more than 25 people can legally be held as long as specific requirements are met.
- Virginians age 5 and over are required to wear face coverings in indoor public spaces. The previous mask mandate, in place since May 29, required residents age 10 and over to wear face coverings.
- There will be "strengthened enforcement" of rules enhanced cleaning, social distancing, wearing face masks at essential businesses, such as grocery stores and pharmacies, and the Virginia Department of Health can hit violators with a Class One misdemeanor.
- The on-site sale, consumption and possession of alcohol is not allowed after 10 p.m. in any restaurant, food court, brewery, microbrewery, distillery, winery or tasting room. Those businesses must also close by midnight.

"Across Virginia, coronavirus cases are on the rise. Our statewide percent positivity is going up, and we're seeing more and more people hospitalized with this virus, and more people are dying," Northam said in a four-minute video message posted to YouTube.

"This is putting a strain on our medical facilities and front-line workers, and it's raising the danger level for every Virginian."

The governor's office said Virginia is averaging 1,500 newly-reported COVID-19 cases per day, up from a statewide peak of around 1,200 cases in May.

Though southwest Virginia is seeing a spike in confirmed cases, all five of the commonwealth's health regions are reporting a positivity rate of over 5%. Hospitalizations have increased statewide by more than 35% in the last four weeks, the governor's office said.


